

Study Contents

Students will study basic subjects while learning Japanese. Students can learn the basic education required for Japanese universities and graduate schools.

Study Contents

Students learn the four skills of "reading, writing, listening, and speaking" in a well-balanced manner from beginner to advanced levels. Whether you are learning Japanese for the first time or already have an intermediate level of Japanese, you can study according to your own level. We also provide guidance so that students can go on to higher education or find employment as they wish. For those who want to take their time to learn Japanese, we recommend the 2-year course.

What is Prep Course?

Our two-year course and one-year and six-month course have been designated as "Prep Courses" by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. Students who have graduated from high school in their countries with less than 12 years of primary and secondary education are not eligible to apply for Japanese universities, but if they complete the Prep Courses, they will be eligible to apply for universities in Japan.

Classes

After entering the school, students take a placement test and are placed in classes that match their abilities. Classes are divided into two sections, morning and afternoon. Basic subjects are taught during the same lunch period for both morning and afternoon classes.

In our school, there are four Japanese language classes a day, each lasting 45 minutes. The classes are designed to help students develop the four skills of reading, writing, listening, and speaking in a well-balanced manner in preparation for higher education. Our school has a class teacher system in order to answer questions and advice about the class.

Individual interviews, career counseling, and supplementary classes will be held outside of class hours as needed. Regular examinations are held at the end of each semester, and students who pass the examinations can move on to the next level. The school is closed on Saturdays, Sundays, and national holidays. In addition, there are about 20 days each of spring, summer, and winter vacations.






part-time job information sessions


Scholarships at our school
